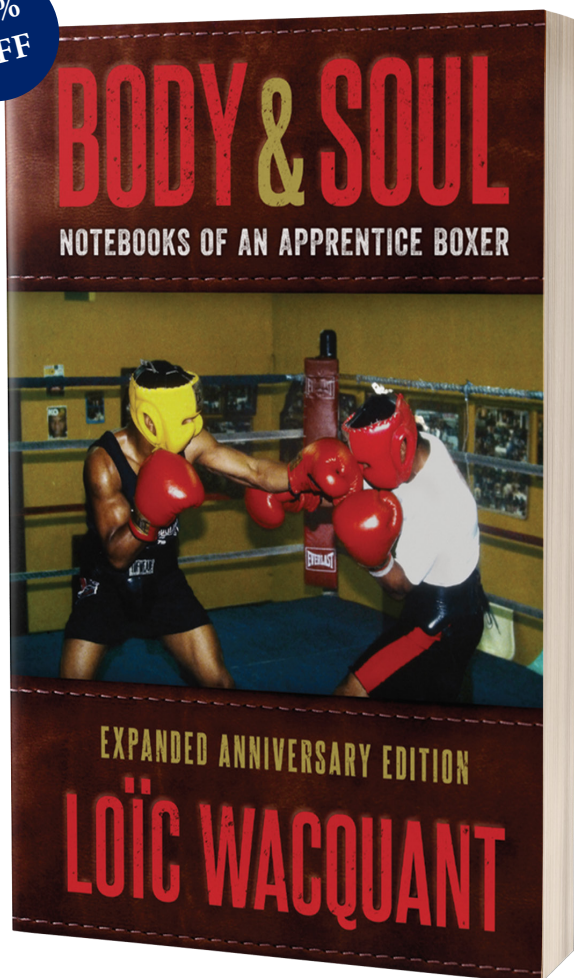

- Retraces the trials and tribulations of the Woodlawn gym members in and out of the ring over the past 30 years and what they disclose about the prizefighting economy, masculinity, and the passion binding the boxers to their craft
