Lesson Title: The Rise of the City Landscape

Map Used: Valladolid Map Date: October 30, 1794 Original Map Dimensions: 55x38 cm

Prior Knowledge

The following lesson assumes that students:

- 1. Possess a greater depth of understanding of complex content material and skills to analyze connections between and among historical periods and events.
- 2. Familiarity with a variety of rich primary and secondary source material such as state papers, legal documents, charters, constitutions, biographies, autobiographies, speeches, letters, literature, music, art, and architecture is encouraged.
- 3. Understand how early civilizations developed

Lesson

- 1. Describe early history of early city planning
- 2. Utilize a map warper / image georeferencer tool to compare historic map with contemporary map (Ex: http://mapwarper.net/)
 - a. Have students point out similarities and differences

Investigate

- 1. Search for present day maps of the city of Morelia previously known as Valladolid
 - a. Identify similarities and differences
- 2. Have students utilize a geobrowser to "visit" the present day city of Morelia, now known as Valladolid (Ex: https://www.google.com/earth/)
 - a. Can students find traces of the historic map? (street names, churches, plazas, etc)

Extended Learning

- 1. Students can search for a similar map of a large city from the same time period using the following online collections/websites
 - a. Identify similarities between chosen map and Valladolid map
 - b. Identify differences between chosen map and Valladolid map
 - c. Identify creating entities of chosen map
- 2. Using the chosen map, students can use map warper to compare to a present day map
