Ransom Center, and the New York Public Library, the Pforzheimer Symposium celebrates the book-collecting legacy of Carl H. Pforzheimer (1879–1957). Long considered one the most significant and discerning book collectors of the twentieth century, Pforzheimer's collection ranged from Gutenberg to Gissing. Today, his collecting is represented in three components that are the focus of this symposium: the Gutenberg Bible and the Pforzheimer Library of English books and manuscripts (1475–1700) at the Harry Ransom Center, and the collection of Shelley and his circle at the New York Public Library.
