How do I participate?

How do I earn certification?

The SEED Program offers two levels of Student Employee Excellence Certification:

- Level 1: attend 6 workshops (two from Module 1 and one from each of the other Modules) and write a 2-page reflection
- Advanced: attend 4 more workshops, write a 2-page reflection, and complete a project that advances student employee training

In addition, you must have worked at least 240 hours in a student job to be certified.

But you can start attending workshops before then!

SEED workshops may also count towards the certification requirements of other programs.
