# **International Student Fees Fact Sheet**

# Taxes on scholarships / fellowships

- There is a mandatory 14% tax withheld from scholarship of fellowship payments made to nonresident aliens for students with a valid F or J student visa.
- The withholding rate is 30% for students without an appropriate student visa.
- If the student is from <u>a treaty country</u> and has completed the treaty benefit application process, no taxes will be deducted from the scholarship/fellowship payment or any taxes that have been deducted will be refunded.
- Eligibility for a tax treaty exemption is based on visa status, country of residence, and other criteria such as history of presence in the United States.
- To check eligibility for applying for tax treaty benefits, contact the <u>International Students and Scholars Office</u>. Once the necessary form has been submitted and approved, the Office of Accounting will process a refund.
- Students may apply for a refund for taxes withheld the previous year by submitting form 1040NR directly to the IRS.
  - o If the department wants to give out a certain net payment amount, they can increase the gross of the payment to include the amount that will be taken out by the tax.

### Insurance Requirement - for Visa status of F or J

- The Texas Board of Regents requires that all international students enrolled at UT in a visa status of F or J carry health insurance
- Enrollment in the UT Student Health Insurance Plan is automatic at the time of registration
- The cost of the policy is included in the student's tuition and fee bill
- The Fall tuition bill will reflect the cost of insurance for the Fall semester
- The Spring tuition bill will reflect the cost of insurance for both Spring and Summer semesters
- Information Sessions regarding UT Health Insurance are offered during Fall Orientation

# **Voluntary Insurance Enrollment – for other Visa Status**

- Only students in an F or J visa status are required by University of Texas System Board of Regents to maintain health insurance and are automatically billed for insurance
- Students in any other visa category have the option to purchase the <u>UT Student Health Insurance Plan</u> during their studies at UT.
- There are deadlines each semester to purchase the Student Health Insurance Plan

#### Waivers

In certain cases listed below, students holding comparable coverage may be eligible to waive enrollment in the UT Student Health Insurance Plan. Please see the ISSS <u>insurance waivers webpage</u> for further waiver eligibility information:

- Graduate student with an Academic Assignment (TA/GRA/AI)
- Spouse/Child of a UT Employee
- Student graduating in Spring
- Graduate Student with a Fellowship
- Student with US Employer Insurance
- Student with Individual Insurance

#### **Additional Fees**

In addition to the health insurance costs that are automatically billed towards tuition, International students are subject to the following fees also added to tuition:

- The ISSS Support Services Fee is \$125 per semester for all non-immigrant international students enrolled at the university, regardless of how many hours they are taking
- A Health Insurance Administrative Fee of 5% added to the cost of the Student Health Insurance Plan premium; mandatory
- International Supplemental Insurance: insurance for the month arrived in the US and before they start to work/school and can get employee insurance (It is a mandatory fee or I think can be paid by dept funding on an SS2 waiver)
- Evacuation fee: Medical Evacuation/Repatriation of Remains coverage that is not covered by employee insurance (transportation of the individual's bodily remains back to their area of principle residence); mandatory
