

Continuing the previous joint conference of the National Geriatrics Institute, INGER and the International Conference on Aging in the Americas, ICAA, the National Geriatrics Institute together with the ICAA technical committee, organized the conference Defining the challenges of cognitive health and mental in older Mexican people in Mexico and the United States in Mexico City, on September 30 and October 1 of this year.
