I hope you are keeping well in these challenging days. The 2020 ICAA meeting entitled *Aging and Resilience* in the U.S. and Mexico has been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, the CAA Advisory Group has begun to prepare for the rescheduled two-day program on September 23- 24, 2021 in Galveston, TX.. In addition to invited speakers and keynote lectures, the International CAA (ICAA) fosters the development of emerging scholars and early career investigators (ESYI) by sponsoring a juried poster session at the end of the first day of the conference. The Call for Abstracts will be announced April 12, 2021 and encourages submissions from all interested graduate students and post-doctoral trainees; the mentoring program is dedicated to maximizing diversity within the ICAA Scholar Network. Kyriakos Markides (UTMB), Verónica ("Vero") Montes de Oca (UNAM and Rogelio Sáenz (UTSA) are the 2021 ICAA Co-Organizers. Revised paper presentations will be peer-reviewed for a special issue of *Journal of Aging and Health*, edited by a subgroup of the CAA Publications Committee.
