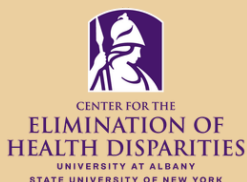
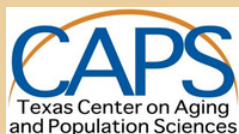

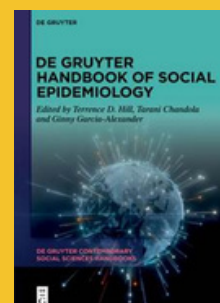
Special Issue Proposal Receives Strong Endorsement

Latino Families in Later Life: A New Caregiver Paradigm
Forthcoming in 2026, this book by Jacqueline L. Angel and Sunshine Rote explores caregiving among older Latinos and their families in the context of major demographic change. The authors examine how care is shaped by culture, migration, health transitions, and structural inequities, and propose a more sustainable and culturally responsive approach to long-term care.
