Programs

In April 2024, CLAVIS organized the third edition of the **ISLAA Forum: Latin American and Latinx Art and Visual Culture Dissertation Workshop**, an international workshop for emerging scholars developed in partnership with the Institute for Studies on Latin American Art (ISLAA). The workshop served 8 doctoral candidates from universities across the United States and included 1 student from Argentina. **Dária Jaremtchuk** (Universidade de São Paulo) and **Camilo Trumper** (University at Buffalo, SUNY) delivered keynote talks and served as the invited scholars.

CLAVIS organized a study visit in May 2024 to the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth for department students and faculty to view *Surrealism and Us: Caribbean and African Diasporic Artists since 1940*. The visit was led by **María Elena Ortiz**, curator of the exhibition. Ortiz delivered a public lecture and led a session of the Permanent Seminar in Latin American Art in March 2024.
