Handshake serves as the College of Liberal Arts' career management system. Internship Courses

Our internship courses are designed as a complement to the internship experience, providing an academic framework, learning objectives, career research, and an opportunity for personal and professional reflective thought. - LA 320 Provides upper-division liberal arts elective credit for students who have secured internships
- LA 110 Provides lower-division liberal arts elective credit for students who
 have secured internships and whose internship organizations require they be
 receiving course credit
- LA 011 0-credit, tuition-free option for student's whose internships require credit or for students who need employment authorization via course credit

Career Courses

• LA 101M - A seminar course designed to expand our services and resources to students in a credit-bearing form. This course provides our students with a 1-hour lower division liberal arts elective credit
