

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING in the HEALTH FIELDS

Internships are an excellent way for students to gain professional experience alongside coursework during a semester or summer abroad.

There are two types of internship programs:

- (1) Internships with coursework
- (2) Internships without coursework



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Students can intern during the summer or semester.
- All internships are part of location-based programs.
- Some programs combine an internship with coursework.
- Placements prioritize students' skill development over company name.
- Most students intern at small, local companies or organizations abroad.
- Most programs offer English-language placements.
- Internships are unpaid, but scholarships can help offset the cost of travel.
- Remote/virtual internships are approved through select internship programs.

INTERNSHIPS WITH COURSEWORK

ABOUT

Internships with coursework offer students the opportunity to enrich their work experience through complementary classroom learning. Coursework varies widely by program, but may include major-specific classes, language acquisition, area studies courses, and/or an internship seminar. Programs are available in fall, spring, summer, or for the academic year. Students must be enrolled full-time during semesters and 6 credits in summer to use financial aid.

1. Internships with Academic-Affiliated Coursework

Affiliate programs offer a cohort-based experience studying with other American and international students in dozens of countries. Many affiliate programs offer part-time or full-time internships in conjunction with coursework. The following affiliated organizations are approved for in-person programs. Through visits to and interaction with organizations and individuals working in India's traditional healthcare system, students gain firsthand exposure to the practices and environments social contexts of these alternative methods of wellness.

SIT: Traditional Medicine & Community Health | Vietnam

- **Affiliate** | Summer
Social, economic, and cultural paradigms that frame traditional Vietnamese medicine. Healthcare and health delivery among diverse groups, including marginalized and indigenous populations. The philosophy behind traditional Vietnamese medicine and its connection with traditional Chinese medicine. Herbal remedies, medicinal preparation, Vietnamese massage, and acupuncture.



INTERNSHIPS WITHOUT COURSEWORK

ABOUT

Non-academic internship programs offer an intensive career development and intercultural experience without coursework. Programs generally include internship placement matching, pre-departure preparation, professional development, and cultural programming. In-person programs will also typically include visa guidance, airport pick-up, housing, arrival orientation, local transportation, and 24/7 on-site support.

These programs are credit-eligible: no credit is built into the program, but participants can simultaneously enroll in a UT internship course, like B A 353. These programs do not qualify for financial aid, but participants are eligible for scholarships. Domestic locations are not approved. Remote/virtual programs are approved.

- **Absolute Internship** provides full-time internship placements for students of all majors. Interns' professional development will be supplemented by the Career Speaker Series, a lecture series by industry professionals.
 - **Locations:** 11 cities across Europe and Asia + remote internships
 - **Program Dates:** 1, 2, or 3 month programs with monthly start-dates year-round
 - **Internship Matching:** Absolute Internship has a network of 800+ host companies and offers internships in 24+ industry specializations. Students are guaranteed an internship in their first choice specialization.
 - **Supplemental Programming & Professional Development:** The internship is supplemented by programming which may include a welcome banquet, city excursions, group dinners, and weekend trips.
- **Child Family Health International (CFHI)** provides ethical health-related internship placements that connect students with local health professionals and community health leaders. These programs can serve as a stepping stone to careers in medicine, nursing, policy, human rights, and business.
 - **Locations:** 12 countries across Latin America, Africa, and Asia + remote internships
 - **Program Dates:** Year round programs: 4-16 week immersion programs, 1 or 2 week intensive programs.
 - **Internship Matching:** CFHI programs ensure that students are experiencing Global Health while maintaining ethical and professional boundaries. Potential placements depend on the location, local laws, student experience, and focus of each program.
 - **Supplemental Programming & Professional Development:** Supplemental programming depends on the program, but may include critical reflection, weekly meetings, and lectures related to health and the local community. All Latin America programs include Spanish language instruction.
- **CRCC Asia** offers full-time internship placements for students of all majors. The internship is supplemented by Career Bridge, a professional development hub including a series of self-guided courses based on the NACE career readiness competencies. Participants can also select a placement-only program or opt to add on guided travel for an additional fee.
 - **Locations:** 10 cities across Asia and the United Kingdom + virtual internships
 - **Program Dates:** 1, 2, or 3 month programs with monthly start-dates year-round
 - **Internship Matching:** CRCC Asia has a network of 1,000+ internship host companies and offers internships in 18 career fields. Students are guaranteed an internship in one of their top three career fields (with 90% placed in their top field.)
 - **Supplemental Programming & Professional Development:** The internship is supplemented by an all-inclusive program which may include a welcome banquet, city excursions, business and cultural events, community outreach activities, and language classes (in China).
- **Global Experiences** runs internship programs for students of all majors supplemented by an award-winning professional development program in collaboration with Gallup Education based on the Clifton StrengthsFINDER assessment.
 - **Locations:** 15 cities in Europe, Australia, and Costa Rica + virtual internships
 - **Program Dates:** Each location has set program dates, typically with one start date per term. Programs are three months in fall and spring, and 2 months in summer.
 - **Internship Matching:** Global Experiences has a network of 4,000+ employers and offers internships in 40 career fields. Students are guaranteed an internship in their desired career field.
 - **Supplemental Programming & Professional Development:** The internship is supplemented by career planning advising, and group social and cultural events.
